

The PATH International Conference and Annual Meeting scheduled in St. Louis, Missouri was postponed due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. To provide virtual continuing education that would have been available at the international conference, PATH International hosted a three-part webinar series. Each series focused on a specific topic and had four presentations per topic. The series included program, disability and administration education and saw 370 registrations.

In the 2020-2021 fiscal year, with the continued pandemic restraints, the region conferences were shifted from in-person to virtual.

The virtual conference held May 13-14, 2021 had **213 registrants** and proved **9 hours of continuing education**.

In August of 2020 the *PATH Intl. CTRI*<sup>TM</sup> *Study Guide* was released. The *PATH Intl. CTRI*<sup>TM</sup> *Study Guide* is intended as a user-friendly resource to assist in preparing for the certification exam and sold almost **500 copies** in the first year of publication.

In February 2021, PATH Intl. launched Member Connection, a new benefit for individual members. Member Connection is an online networking platform that allows members to share resources and expertise for center programing, administration and credentialed professionals.

Free education continues to be one of the most popular benefits within the membership tier structure. In the 2021-2022 year members accessed almost **6,200 hours of free continuing education** up from 3,961 accessed the previous (and first) year offering this membership benefit.

In the second year of not requiring individual membership to become or maintain certification to meet NCCA standards for the accreditation of the PATH Intl. Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor as expected, there was a 27% decrease in individual member numbers.

The PATH Intl. Member Outreach Committee (MOC) is the voice of the PATH Intl. membership, advocating for their interests to the association and the industry. The committee actively supports the organization in identifying and implementing membership features that will enhance the value of association membership and convey the importance of the equine-assisted services (EAS) industry. The MOC provides outreach and support for PATH Intl. centers and members as well as outreach to those outside the association. The MOC leads and supports the Region Leadership Teams who provide essential local outreach through networking, hosting educational opportunities and events.

During the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the region representatives and region leadership teams reached out over 1,500 times to PATH Intl. Member Centers to provides support, enhance the regional communities and aid with renewals. In addition, they communicated with over 1,600 individual members throughout the year to provide answers about membership and certification and invites to virtual events. They also provided the association with regional updates for PATH Intl. communications.

As part of the shift to virtual networking during the pandemic, regions were provided regional Zoom accounts to better connect with members as all in-person events were cancelled. The regions held 30 virtual state meetings and hosted numerous virtual networking opportunities during the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

The trek to independent accreditation of the PATH Intl. Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor® (CTRI®) Certification continued in 2020-2021. We made great strides in the number of applicants, candidates and credentialing holders since the launch of the CTRI certification program in 2019. PATH Intl. Registered Therapeutic Riding Instructors continued to participate in the process to transition to the new CTRI credential. By the end of June 2021, an additional **960 instructors** had transitioned.

The global pandemic continued to present significant impacts on credentialing. In person events and the number of newly certified instructors continued slowly increased as restrictions eased. PATH Intl. is proud of the resourcefulness demonstrated by our members, certified professionals and instructors in training and their mentors as they adapted their programing to continue to serve as many participants as they could while navigating the continually changing coronavirus climate.

# **Veterans Programs**

The ongoing partnership with Wounded Warrior Project helped **96 PATH Intl. Premier Accredited Centers** provide **1,568 sessions** to **614 WWP alumni** – totaling **\$116,625 in reimbursement to the centers.** The centers' ability to provide in-person services due to the pandemic was felt in the first quarter of 2020 but in the last three quarters of the year centers were able to resume inperson services and pivot to virtual services.

PATH Intl. was awarded the United States Department of Veterans Affairs Adaptive Sports Grant for the 2020-2021 grant cycle. The award was limited to specific geographical locations which resulted in fewer veterans being able to be served than past awarded years.



The marketing and communications department had another busy and fruitful year as we continue to strive to meet the strategic plan goals and objectives within budget while serving members and supporting all areas of the organization with strategy and fulfillment of communications and other marketing tactics. For instance there were launches of new member benefits—Member Connection and Abenity as well as the communications planning of the rollout and implementation of the optimal terminology and supporting documents for the EAS industry. Plans were created to update all PATH Intl. materials to reflect the terminology changes. Thousands of changes were required to association documents, electronic media, etc.!

For credentialing, the federally registered trademark for PATH Intl. CTRI® was submitted and approved. Facebook ads for the then new PATH Intl. Study Guide yielded a reach of 10,860 and 3,057 engagement!

Partnerships continue with the organization's largest supporters. Markel renewed their sponsorship at a higher level and Don Faison, their managing executive with their marketing and underwriting teams from met with PATH Intl. to reaffirm their commitment to PATH Intl. despite the retirement of much loved, Deb Peloso's retirement. Both Markel and Purina supplied :30 second ads to play during the fall/winter webinar series that were also used during our awards presentation.

## Website

Google AdGrants continues to provide approx. \$9500 worth of free online ads per month which we use to market the organization to external audiences. Press releases with links to images are being sent in local and national markets for PATH Intl. award winners.

The website had approximately 185,000 unique viewers in fiscal year 2020-2021. The approximation rather than an actual number is due to the start of a new website process, which changed the analytics. The website pages visited most often include certifications, which again topped the list of most visited pages. Other pages in the top ten were Find a

Center, Locate my region, Job Center and My Instructor Membership.

In November 2020, PATH Intl. worked with an external organization to create a request for proposals (RFP) for a new website. The RFP was distributed widely and a contractor was hired to design and implement a new website. This was very exciting, as we have wanted to change the website for quite some time! The projected kicked off with really concentrated work of defining website audiences through personas and the mapping of their journey through their interactions with the association.

## **Email Communications**

PATH Intl. continues to use Constant Contact to distribute association communications to its members. In the 2020-2021 fiscal year, PATH Intl. sent out **263 eblasts**. That volume was down from the previous year, which was a good thing as many members request fewer communications. The decrease can be attributed to fewer COVID-19


communication as the pandemic began to normalize in 2021.

The average email open rate is an incredible 40%, considerably higher than the percentage for other nonprofits and all email marketing.

## Social Media

Facebook is still the most used social media channel of the association, with **20,000 followers** at the end of 2021. The post with the most likes and shares was a post about tools for instructors. This is somewhat surprising since a good many of our most liked posts are the inspiring or funny ones about horses. We try to balance informational and inspirational posts.

Other social media channels include PATH International Equine Services for Heroes® Facebook page with 2,790 followers; Twitter with 1,993; LinkedIn with 1,993; and Instagram with 2,195. LinkedIn continues to be used to present the professional face of the association and has been used to connect with webinar and conference presenters as well as recruiting for board members.




