



## **PATH Intl. Mentor Training**

This training is designed for any PATH Intl. member to attend. It is meant to help provide you with valuable and up to date information on the most efficient way to help PATH Intl. Instructors In Training going through the certification process. You do not need to be a current PATH Intl. instructor to attend. This training is not required at this time for those PATH Intl. Certified Instructors who wish to mentor other Instructor In Training candidates.

In order to be an official mentor, for the 25 hours of mounted teaching for our Instructors In Training, you must be a PATH Intl. Certified Instructor member in good standing. This workshop will help you be a better mentor and qualify to be added to the PATH Intl. mentor list on the website so instructor candidates can contact you.

This training is a pre-requisite to PATH Intl. evaluator training if you wish you to become an evaluator for PATH Intl. On-site Certifications.

Pre-requisites for taking the course:

- Complete a review of the online CAT and Self Study, unless you have completed it within the last 12 months.
- 18 or older
- PATH Intl. member

Requirements for becoming a PATH Intl. Mentor listed in STRIDES and on the website:

- Be a current PATH Intl. member and hold current PATH Intl. Instructor Certification (Registered, Advanced, Master, Driving, Vaulting, ect.)
- Successful completion of a PATH Intl. Mentor Training
- Access to e-mail for online communication
- Signed permission, completed at the end of the mentor workshop, to be advertised on the website



## **PATH Intl. Evaluator Training**

Pre-requisites:

- PATH Intl. member
- Attend mentor training
- Complete exam and book provided by the PATH Intl. office
- Attend an official Evaluator Training
- Currently hold PATH Intl. Advanced and/or Master Level Certification and/or Driving Level I or II Certification
- Be 21 or older
- After completing the training you will apprentice, at your own expense, at a minimum of two registered on-site workshops and certifications and receive positive recommendations to become an associate evaluator
